The California Pharmacists Association (CPhA) and the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) write to request your office work with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Administration for Strategic Preparedness & Response (ASPR) on activating the Emergency Prescription Assistance Program (EPAP) in Los Angeles.

EPAP provides critical support to individuals without health insurance in federally designated disaster areas. By ensuring access to essential prescription medications, vaccinations, medical supplies, and equipment, EPAP helps individuals meet their immediate health needs during times of crisis. This program is vital in aiding disaster-affected communities, alleviating individual hardships, and reducing strain on the broader healthcare system.

In light of the devastating Los Angeles fires, many patients face significant challenges in accessing essential healthcare and medications. To support the continuity of care for vulnerable populations during this disaster, CPhA and APhA strongly urge your office to promptly collaborate with HHS and ASPR to activate the EPAP.
