RE: Pharmacists as Providers - SUPPORT

Dear Director Wilson:

The Delaware Pharmacists Society (DPS) and the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) appreciate the opportunity to provide comments on the proposed state plan amendment (SPA) to recognize and reimburse pharmacists as a provider type by Delaware Medicaid.¹ Our organizations would like to thank Governor Carney and the Division of Medicaid and Medical Assistance for the implementation of this important policy that will increase access to care for Delawareans. Realigning financial incentives in our health care system to allow for health plan reimbursement under the medical benefit of services provided by pharmacists ensures patients have more time with their most accessible health care professional, their pharmacist. It also properly aligns the current role of the pharmacist, with their extensive education and training, to practice at the top of their license.

Overall, our organizations support the proposed changes to Attachment 3.1-A Page 3.1 Addendum, Page 9 Addendum, and Attachment 4.19-B Page 1. We feel these proposed changes will increase Medicaid beneficiaries' access to the numerous health care services pharmacists provide in Delaware.

Additionally, our organizations request the Division publish an administrative notice confirming that pharmacists' services provided in federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and rural health clinics (RHCs) will also be a covered benefit for Medicaid beneficiaries under the prospective payment system (PPS) methodology and the alternative payment methodology (APM). Our organizations also recommend the administrative notice include an explanation of the process for FQHCs and RHCs to update their encounter rates to include pharmacists' services.

In the Delaware state plan, the definition of *FQHC Services and Other Ambulatory Services* defers to "section 4231 of the State Medicaid Manual",² and includes in the definition, "Any other ambulatory service included in a State's Medicaid plan is considered a covered FQHC service, if the FQHC offers such a service." With the approval of the *Pharmacists as Providers* SPAs, pharmacists' services will be included in the State's Medicaid plan and should be a covered FQHC service. RHC services are broadly included with no limitations in the state plan⁴ and should include pharmacists' services.

We believe that no additional changes to the SPAs is necessary and an administrative notice confirming that pharmacists' services provided in FQHCs and RHCs will also be a covered benefit for Medicaid beneficiaries under the prospective payment system (PPS) methodology and the APM will ensure patients in all outpatient health care settings can receive needed health care services from their trusted community pharmacist. Other states have taken similar steps. For example, the Ohio Department of Medicaid published a Medicaid Advisor Letter⁵ on December 15, 2020, confirming that pharmacists' services were covered when provided in FQHCs and RHCs.

Our organizations greatly appreciate the Division's work to expand access to pharmacists' services to Medicaid beneficiaries. Thank you for your time and consideration of our comments.
