Vaccines are for adults, too!



Vaccines can help prevent you from getting many diseases and keep you out of the hospital.

Getting vaccinated is especially important to protect the people around you who may be at risk of becoming seriously ill. So, by getting vaccinated, you can protect yourself as well as your family, friends, and other people in your community.



Vaccines for all adults

Several vaccines are recommended for adults, including:

- » Influenza vaccine (every year)
- » COVID-19 vaccine (as recommended)
- » Tdap vaccine (as recommended)
 Tetanus booster (every 10 years)
- » Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for adults 19-26 years old
- » Hepatitis B vaccine for adults 19-59 years old and for adults 60 years and older who have risk factors for disease (and have not previously completed the vaccination series)
- » Shingles vaccine (also known as zoster vaccine) for adults 50 years and older
- » Pneumococcal vaccine for adults 65 years and older



Vaccines you might need

Talk with your pharmacist or doctor about your need for these vaccines:

- » Meningococcal B (MenB) vaccine for adults 23 years old and younger
- » Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for adults 27-45 years old
- » Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccine for adults 60 years and older
- » Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV20) for adults 65 years and older who have previously received other pneumococcal vaccines
- » Hepatitis B (HepB) vaccine for adults 60 years and older who are not at high risk for disease



Vaccines for certain adults

Talk to your doctor or pharmacist about additional vaccines you may need if you:

- » Have certain medical conditions (such as a weakened immune system, diabetes, respiratory diseases)
- » Take certain medications
- » Are going through life events (such as pregnancy)
- » Work at certain jobs (such as health care worker)
- » Are traveling to certain high-risk areas
